TRADITIONAL In person; In classrooms

REMOTE Students at home; Teachers at school Closure determined by national, state or local officials

ACADEMICS

- Teachers will address learning gaps from prior closure and summer. Initially, homework will not be required. Reading/studying at home will be encouraged.
- K-5th grade students will use new English Language Arts and math manipulatives (included in tool kits if schools close.)
- Students in grades 6-12 will be introduced to online learning tools in Google Classroom (to be used in case of closure).

- Teachers will be at school buildings all day and be accessible via online/phone. Weekly personal contact with students required.
- K-5 students will receive a "tool kit" of resources and regular contact with teachers. Homework drop off and new assignments will occur once a week. Grades 6-12 students will check in daily; access classes online.
- Grades and feedback will be provided.
- Contingencies will be made for those with limited or no internet access.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- Parents will be asked to check for fevers prior to students leaving home.
- Face coverings and assigned seating will be required on buses.
- Temperature checks at entrances. Children with fevers will be sent home.
- Social distancing will be observed with face coverings in hallways and common areas. Clear dividers may be used at desks and in cafeterias.
- Hand washing, sanitizing surfaces and other cautions will be modeled and encouraged.
- No non-essential visitors or field trips.
- Daily cleaning of classrooms and buildings.

- Meals will be available for pick up at designated and announced time periods.
- Checking on the emotional well-being of students will be a priority as teachers interact with students online and with personal contacts.

Monitored Distance Education will be provided for students for whom attendance at school constitutes a health risk or for those whose parents determine a return to in-class learning is not advisable. Contact the school principal for more information.

TRANSPORTATION

- Face coverings are required on buses.
- Assigned seating will be socially distanced when feasible.
- Families can sit together.
- In the mornings, students will load from the back to the front of the bus and in the afternoon the first off will load from front to back.
- Sanitizer will be provided on each bus.

- Bus routes will be utilized on an as needed basis.

NUTRITION

- Staff will observe guidelines dictated by the CDC and local health authorities regarding face coverings, gloves, sanitizing, etc.
- Distribution of meals within each facility will be customized to ensure safety.
- Breakfasts being served from a cart or cafeteria will be pre-bagged to eliminate students handling items.
- Lunches being served in the cafeteria will be pre-boxed to eliminate students handling items and to expedite the flow.
- Students will still have a milk flavor choice.

- If schools are closed, meals will continue to be provided on a drive-by basis at the student's school.
- Only students enrolled in that particular school will be served there.
- Families with students in multiple schools will need to travel to each school.
- Costs of the meals must be covered in an account on SchoolCafe.com unless the student qualifies for free meals.
